## **Background**

### **Crime (from Al Lang):**

“The issue of crime reporting has been discussed often over the past several years as had the important issue of adequate police protection: The Council did replace our security services about 2 years ago with off-duty fully authorized Montgomery County Police officers while also extending the coverage hours. I have felt for sometime that TOCC really needed to take a serious look at our policing using outside expertise.

I would suggest there is also a fourth explanation to the 3 you suggest below: we have in fact taken steps to ameliorate the problem and continue to assess those steps and to take additional steps.

In addition, the PSC is looking into the very issues, e.g., the reporting, you raise below. If your time permits perhaps you could attend a PSC meeting to further discuss. The Community Relations Comm also has a policy on reporting crime, which the Town Office can provide and which all thoughts would be welcomed. And I will try and keep you apprised of what TOCC is doing, but do feel free to contact me via email or 202 320 6202.”
