Trees of significance along the Capital Crescent Trail

The attached map shows the results of a cursory site survey to identify any trees of significance located along the Capital Crescent Trail bordering the Town of Chevy Chase.

We found 4 trees on private property that are of significance to the individual residents as well as the Town of Chevy Chase.

1. 4317 Elm Steet. – 60” diameter American Elm.
2. 4409 Elm Street – 35 “ diameter Black Walnut
3. 4411 Elm Street – twin trunk American Beech – 29” diameter and 27” diameter
4. 4509 Elm Street – triple trunk Red Maple – 43” diameter, 24” diameter and 21” diameter

We also noted that the upper end of the trail, near East West Highway, is heavily forested with a majority of Tulip Poplar trees both on public and private land.
