The Climate & Environment Committee

The Town's Climate & Environment Committee (CEC) enjoys participation from a great group of Town residents with expertise, experience, and interest in environmental issues. Following a very successful Green Town Fair in 2018, CEC committee members engaged in a thorough and collaborative process to create and refine a list of potential projects for 2019. After gathering feedback from residents using an online survey tool, the top priorities were matched up with volunteers to create task teams, each producing an event or policy recommendations for the Town Council. The task teams delivered on several important projects this year:

- The Landscape Noise Reduction Team worked on ways to limit noise from landscaping equipment, including an ordinance to expand "quiet hours" and workshops with other communities to discuss a potential ban on gas-powered leaf blowers and demonstrate the benefits of battery-powered equipment.
- The Triple R Team (Reduce, Reuse, Recycle) helped launch the Town's successful glass recycling program and worked with the Community Relations Committee to eliminate the use of plastic water bottles and other plastic items at Town events.
- The Sustainable Garden Team completed the first phase of the Lee Dennison Sustainable Garden in Zimmerman Park. Look for the Grand Opening next spring!
- CEC teams also produced an event about Carbon Pricing and the Green New Deal featuring Congressman Raskin; promoted discussions about Community Solar; and organized a "Forest Bathing" seminar and nature hike in Rock Creek Park.

CEC is considering a wide range of projects for 2020. For example, should we replace Town streetlights with efficient LEDs? Research options for better recycling outcomes? Meet over a vegetarian potluck dinner to learn about food impacts on climate change? Keep pushing for cleaner, quieter landscape equipment? We need YOUR input to decide which of the nineteen potential projects should be priorities for the Town. **Please help us pick winning projects** by taking a short survey, available on the Town website.

Leaf Vacuuming to End in Mid-December



Vacuum trucks will collect leaves continually, street by street, through mid-December. All leaves should be raked to the curb, not into the street. After collection has ended, please place leaves in reusable containers or paper yard waste bags and place them at the curb by 7 a.m. for Monday yard waste collection. The final leaf collection date will be announced via Town Crier.

Town Office Closures

The Town office will be closed on December 24 & 25 and on December 31 & January 1. On December 23 & 30, the Town office will be closed, but Town staff will monitor voicemail and email remotely and will respond to any issues or emergencies reported on those days.

Holiday Trash Collection

Recycling will not be collected on Christmas Day, Wednesday, December 25 or on New Year's Day, Wednesday, January 1. Following each holiday, recycling will be collected on Thursday or Friday, coinciding with your regular household trash collection day.

Climate & Environment Committee 2020 Priorities Survey

The Climate & Environment Committee is conducting an online survey so residents can provide input on its list of nineteen proposed initiatives for 2020. Initiatives include events, campaigns, research, and projects. The survey is open until December 13, and results will be provided during a committee meeting on Tuesday, January 7 at 7 p.m. in the Town Hall. Lee Dennison Sustainable Garden -- First Phase Complete

As many residents have noticed, the first phase of the Lee Dennison Sustainable Garden is complete, but there is still work to be done. The Town has closed the garden for the winter to protect the plantings and make some repairs. We ask that people and pets stay out of the garden until next spring, when finishing touches should be in place in preparation for a Grand Opening Celebration in April or May.

Water and Sewer Emergencies

Please report any water main breaks or other water or sewer emergencies to WSSC at 301-206-4002. Also, we encourage residents to report emergencies to the Town office when it is open. When the office is closed, or on evenings, weekends, and holidays, please contact an elected official. Town staff and Councilmembers can escalate matters with WSSC officials if there is no, or a slow, response. RECYCLING TIP OF THE MONTH

Items such as plastic bottles, yogurt and soup containers can be recycled by our recycling contractor. However, all containers must be clean. In addition, please leave the caps and lids on the containers so they do not clog the recycling machinery.



You cannot recycle clamshell food containers, plastic cups, plates or utensils, plastic tablecloths or Styrofoam. If you must use disposable tableware, please look for compostable products.
